## Second Session: July 9-13 THE CHURCH IN THE APOSTOLIC AGE

Many non-Catholics reject most of the distinctly Catholic practices and beliefs as human traditions, not founded on Scripture. The Church's understanding of the sacraments and the nature of the Church itself are often seen as mere imports from pagan culture. They present the reformation as a return to a truly Bible-based Christianity. But even an introductory study of the time of the Apostles and their immediate successors (the Apostolic Fathers) shows that this view does not stand the test of history. What the Church believed then, at the time of the apostles themselves, was decidedly Catholic, recognizably what we still believe and always have believed. Studying these first generations of Catholics is both a great blessing and provides answers to many questions about our faith. Participants should have completed the First Session (Introductory Survey), either this year or in a previous year.

#### NATIVITY OF ST JOHN THE BAPTIST

John the Baptist spent his adult life preparing the way for Jesus. and proclaiming that "the Kingdom of Heaven is close at hand.". He was born to Zechariah and Elizabeth. The Angel Gabriel had visited Zechariah and told him that his wife would bear a child, even though she was already past the child-bearing age. Elizabeth was Mary's cousin and Zechariah was a priest of the Temple in Jerusalem. As a baby in the womb, John recognized Jesus' presence in Mary's womb when Mary visited Elizabeth soon after the Annunciation. As a young adult, he lived as a hermit in the desert of Judea. When he was 30, he began to preach on the banks of the Jordan, calling for repentance and baptizing people in the river. When Jesus came to John to be baptized, John recognized Jesus as the Messiah and baptized Him, saying: "It is I who need baptism from you." John was imprisoned by Herod Antipas, after he denounced the king's adulterous marriage with Herodias, wife of his half-brother Philip. John was beheaded at the request of Salome, daughter of Herodias. Many came to know Jesus through John.

#### FEAST OF SS. PETER & PAUL



"In front of Saint Peter's Basilica, as is well known, there are two imposing statues of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, easily recognizable by their respective attributes: the keys in the hand of Peter and the sword held by Paul. Likewise, at the main entrance to the Basilica of Saint

Paul Outside the Walls, there are depictions of scenes from the life and the martyrdom of these two pillars of the Church. Christian tradition has always considered Saint Peter and Saint Paul to be inseparable: indeed, together, they represent the whole Gospel of Christ. In Rome, their bond as brothers in the faith came to acquire a particular significance. Indeed, the Christian community of this City considered them a kind of counterbalance to the mythical Romulus and Remus, the two brothers held to be the founders of Rome. A further parallel comes to mind, still on the theme of brothers: whereas the first biblical pair of brothers demonstrate the effects of sin, as Cain kills Abel, yet Peter and Paul, much as they differ from one another in human terms and notwithstanding the conflicts that arose in their relationship, illustrate a new way of being brothers, lived according to the Gospel, an authentic way made possible by the grace of Christ's Gospel working within them. Only by following Jesus does one arrive at this new brotherhood: this is the first and fundamental message that today's solemnity presents to each one of us, the importance of which is mirrored in the pursuit of full communion, so earnestly desired by the ecumenical Patriarch and the Bishop of Rome, as indeed by all Christians... Excerpt of homily of Pope Benedict XVI, June 2012, St. Peter's Basilica
