TWO SAINTS



St. Philip Neri and St. Ignatius Loyola most likely met for the first time at the Hospital San Giacomo for incurables just outside of Rome, where they and their respective followers were both ministering to the sick and dying. Over time they became

good friends, and St. Philip encouraged a number of his own disciples who had a more missionary bent to become Jesuits. Indeed, St. Ignatius for quite some time had hoped that St. Philip himself would become a Jesuit, and this very well could have happened given St. Philip's missionary zeal. www.blogofthecourtier.com

The author of this blog continues with the story that St Philip wished to follow St Francis Xavier to the east to spread the Gospel and possibly shed his blood for Christ, but was told by a holy monk, "Your Indies is to be Rome." (This true story is very different from the fictional account in a popular recent Italian movie "about" St Philip. Although the movie is very charming, and many people like the music, it is riddled with falsehoods.)

SHRINES OF CANADA

There are many shrines in Canada, mainly in Quebec. But there is one in Ontario which is not too far to drive for a family day trip: Martyrs' Shrine in Midland, Ontario. This shrine is dedicated to the memory of the Canadian Martyrs who were killed in the area.

The martyrs were eight French missionaries, six Jesuits and two "donnés", laymen who served the Jesuits. The Jesuits were St. Isaac Jogues (1608-1646), St. Antoine Daniel (1600-1648), St. Jean de Brébeuf (1593-1649), St. Gabriel Lalemant (1610-1649), St. Charles Garnier (1606-1649) and St. Noël Chabanel (1613-1649). The laymen were St. René Goupil (1608-1642) and St. Jean de la Lande (160?-1646). Five were killed in Huron territory.

Fr. de Brébeuf was the first of the Jesuit missionaries to arrive in Huronia on the shores of Georgian Bay, in 1626. He was a large man, very strong, but gentle in character. He worked for 20 years throughout Huronia, becoming a master of the native languages and learning the local native customs and practices, so as to develop the best approach to teaching them about Christ. He established mission outposts and taught the Jesuit newcomers the native languages so that they too could teach the Word.

While respectful of the Black Robes, the Hurons were a superstitious people. They allowed only their dying children and infirm adults to be baptized. In 1640, when they had suffered from drought and illness for several years, they decided it must be because of the Black Robes, and they began to harass the missions and the missionaries.

By 1649, the possibility of martyrdom was ever more present. Although now an important ally of the Hurons and known as the "Apostle of the Hurons," Fr. de Brebeuf and fellow Jesuit, Gabriel Lalemant, were captured by the warring Mohawk, bound to crosses and tortured for hours. They were martyred on March 16, 1649 at St. Ignace.

Pope Pius XI beatified these eight martyrs on June 21, 1925. They were canonized on June 29, 1930. Pope Pius XII declared the Canadian Martyrs Secondary Patrons of Canada, after St. Joseph.

There will be pilgrimage in honour of Our Lady of Kibeho and St. Josephine Bakhita at Canadian Martyrs' Shrine on **Saturday**, **August 18**. Bishop Robert Kasun, Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Toronto will be the Celebrant.
