(Luke 18:16) The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program responds to Christ's instruction by creating a Montessori-style environment, called the Atrium, where children are able to come to God in their own way and at their own speed. In the Atrium, children from the age of three onward are introduced to the essential truths of the faith through handmade materials that encourage meditation. The program normally runs in a small group setting, once a week, in a dedicated space. 
Men & Women of the Old Testament
