-Historical: Canadian Senate passed euthanasia law in time for summer break.

-Canada's euthanasia deaths increased by 50% in 2018

Ontario euthanasia deaths are rising quickly.

-UN Disability rights envoy urges changes to Canada's euthanasia law.

-Québec court expands euthanasia law by striking down the terminal illness requirement.

-Québec Fourth Interim Euthanasia Report, 13 deaths did not comply with the law.

-BC Health Minister orders Delta Hospice to do euthanasia by February 3.
