

BLESSED SEBASTIAN VALFRE



"When it is all over you will not regret having suffered; rather you will regret having suffered so little, and suffered that little so badly." Bl Sebastian was born on March 9, 1629 to a humble and poor family. He remained poor throughout his life

in the Congregation at Turin. At the Oratory he wished simply to serve the people of God in whatever capacity he was given; whether in pastoral work, house administration, scholarly pursuits, or sweeping the stairs. He would as happily go to the death beds of the poor or the Royal family of Savoy. Most of his life was spent wandering around the streets and squares simply being available, speaking of God's love for all men and of the love that we should have for each other.The Apostle of Turin died on January 30, 1710. He was beatified by Pope Gregory XVI in 1834.

ST. BLAISE

There are few facts known about this saint of the fourth century. According to legends, he was of noble birth and was raised a Christian. He became a priest and then Bishop of Sebastea in Armenia. In the time of persecution, he fled to the mountains, living in a cave where he tended to the sick and wounded animals. He saved a young boy who was choking to death with a fishbone in his throat. When he was captured and imprisoned the boy's mother gave him food and candles. **Thus, the practice of blessing throats with candles on St. Blaise's feast day, as we will do after the 8 a.m. Mass on February 3.** As legend goes, St. Blaise's flesh was torn with wool combs before he was beheaded. He is the patron of throat illness, attacks of wild animals and veterinarians
