

<u>100^{тн} ANNIVERSARY CORNER</u> Divine Mercy Sunday


Last Saturday night, when the sun had gone down, we began the solemn Easter Vigil Mass. The vigil begins with the lighting and blessing of the Easter fire, the fire that represents God the Father. The fire is then used to light the Paschal candle that represents God the Son made man, crucified and risen from the dead. The Paschal (Easter/Passover) Candle is then carried into the darkened church. From that one candle, all those in the church who are baptized light their own small candles. Christ is the light of the world. He enlightens everyone who enters this world. If the Easter fire represents the Father and the Paschal Candle represents the Son, what represents the Holy Spirit? The flame itself. The Holy Spirit is the living flame of Love that springs forth from the Father and the Son. The Holy Spirit descended on the Church at Pentecost as tongues of fire.

Why does the Holy Spirit appear as fire? Why is fire that is spread from one person to another so representative of the Holy Spirit? Fire transforms what it touches into itself. When the flame of one candle touches the wick of another, the wick is turned into fire. The Holy Spirit transforms into itself all those it touches.

The Holy Spirit is the mutual Love and Joy, the mutual loving Acceptance of the Father for the Son and the Son for the Father. The Holy Spirit unites the Father and the Son in a bond of joyful Love. Well, we are called to be, in the words of a recent saint, "a bond of connection between persons, a link in a chain."

God has formed humanity into a mystical Body, his Church. Christ is the head of this body and we are his members. Each one of us has a part to play. No one can be thrown away. We are connected to Christ and to each other. The spiritual union between the body parts is the soul. And in the mystical Body of Christ, the Church, the Holy Spirit is present in the whole Body and in each member. The Holy Spirit makes us one Body in Christ.

Last Saturday night, seven new living members of this Body were born in our church. At our eight-sided font in the back of the church, seven people were baptized. They professed their faith in Christ and received the gift of the Holy Spirit. With us, they call on God their Father. After they were baptized, an eighth new Catholic made his solemn profession of faith and was received into full communion with the Catholic Church. Please pray for these eight new for their families Catholics. Please pray and 100th sponsors/godparents. Last weekend was the anniversary of the first Easter celebrations in our present "upper church." We give glory to the Holy Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, for the many graces of this centenary year. These eight new Catholic Christians must be a constant source of thanksgiving. God is showing special favour to our parish this year. May we cooperate with His grace. May we live as children of the Father, brothers and sisters of God the Son, and Temples of the Holy Spirit. May we imitate the Holy Spirit in uniting others to Jesus Christ!
