

100TH ANNIVERSARY CORNER

Why does our church have images of the keys on the ceiling? Why do we have images of a sword over a bible? These are the first two medallions at the front of the church, just over the side entrance. The keys represent St Peter. The sword and bible represent St Paul who was beheaded with a sword and who wrote almost half of the books of the New Testament. St Peter and St Paul are the first saints listed in the First Eucharistic prayer. The first Eucharistic prayer, also called the Roman Canon, originates with St Ambrose in the late 4th century.

Over time, in Rome, after invoking the Blessed Virgin Mary (and later St Joseph), the canon developed a list of 24 male saints. The first 12 are the Apostles, beginning with Sts Peter and Paul. In the second half of the canon, we have 14 more saints together with St John the Baptist. In that list we have seven female saints. More on them next week!

These lists of saints are not random choices. Why 24? Because in Revelation 4:4 we read that around the throne of God there are set 24 thrones. 12 of the thrones are for the apostles. The 24 saints in the canon remind us that the Mass is a sharing in the Liturgy of heaven. Our ceiling with the Apostles represented points us to the banquet of the Lamb. At Mass, the Lamb of God, living but standing as if slain, is made present. At the moment when the bread becomes the body of Christ, Christ in his risen and ascended glory is made present on our altar. He allows us to share in his worship of the Father. He then feeds us with his life-giving flesh so that we might receive power to live as children of God.

On this Sunday, we have 20 young people receiving their first Holy Communion. Please pray for them as they take part in the wedding banquet of the Lamb. Pray for their generous teachers. Pray for their families. Christ feeds us with Himself so that we might follow Him to heaven.
