100TH ANNIVERSARY CORNER

Thanks to many generous donors, we are getting closer to the \$100,000 goal of our Foundation Stone appeal! Note that the amount on the 'thermometer' in the narthex of the church does not include the matching donation. So, the actual amount raised is double the amount shown on the thermometer.

On Sundays at St Vincent's, the priests always use the Roman Canon, the "long" Eucharistic prayer with two lists of saints. The first list begins with Mary and Joseph and then mentions 24 male saints representing the 24 elders around the throne of God in the book of Revelation. The second list begins with John the Baptist and then mentions 14 saints (seven men and seven women). In the history of art, images of Christ are often displayed with Mary and John the Baptist on either side. They are sometimes called deesis icons or prayer/supplication icons. Often Mary and John are depicted with many other saints.

The Roman Canon can thus be thought of as a kind of deesis icon, depicting Christ in the middle with saints praying to him on either side. Before the consecration, the list headed by Mary includes the 12 Apostles, popes, bishops, priests, deacons, and lay leaders of the church.

But how will new members be added to the Church? How do people recognize that the Holy Spirit dwells in the Church? How do people come to faith? Here the Church needs more than the hierarchy; she needs the Holy Spirit to give her other gifts, charisms, for the building up of the faith. St Paul lists 9 of them in 1 Corinthians 12:7-11, beginning with the three that help the Church preach persuasively: the utterance of wisdom, the utterance of knowledge, and the utterance of faith. But to confirm the divine origin of this message, the Church needs men and women who perform miracles, healings, prophecy, and the discernment of spirits. Finally, in order to make sure that the Gospel is heard in an intelligible way, she needs men and women with the gift of tongues and the interpretation of tongues.

It is precisely the fourteen saints in the second half of the Roman Canon that point us to the charisms, the charismatic graces. The list begins with Stephen, the first martyr, who spoke so persuasively to the Jews, explained the Scriptures, and who saw a vision of Christ standing at the right hand of God. Stephen's graces led to the conversion of St Paul. Matthias is then mentioned. Matthias was chosen to replace Judas just before Pentecost and had the gift of tongues. There is Alexander whose certainty of faith paved the way for St Athanasius. There is Ignatius whose life is filled with prophecy and interpreting tongues. There are Marcellinus and Peter, friends, who converted many people while in prison. There is St Lawrence and his miraculous humour while being grilled alive: "turn me over, I am done on this side."

Among the female saints, Perpetua and Felicity are famous for the utterance of knowledge and wisdom. They received messages from God which they profoundly communicated to others. When Felicity gave birth in prison, for example, the guard made fun of her pains in childbirth ""How can you expect to face the lions when you cannot give birth without tears?" "Today, I am suffering," she said, "but tomorrow, another will be suffering in me."

These female saints also confirmed the Gospel by deeds that only God can do. Full of prophetic gifts, St Lucy obtained healing for her mother at the tomb of St Agatha. St Agatha is also known for mighty deeds: stopping volcanos. St Agnes showed miraculous constancy as a teenage martyr to chastity. St Cecilia had discernment of spirits in knowing the inner movements of the heart. St Anastasia is known for her great service to the poor and her ability to heal people from poison. Her name means Resurrection.

These female saints remind us that God wants to raise us up from our sins and lack of faith. To raise us up, he uses charisms in the Church. Let us pray for our parish in this centenary year. May God fill this parish with the graces needed to draw many to Christ. The Gospel is not spread primarily by human organization and cleverness. We need charisms. We need the Holy Spirit to renew in our lives the graces of Pentecost. First Communion

At each Mass, we relive the Paschal Mystery, the mystery of Our Lord's death, resurrection, ascension, and sending of the Holy Spirit.
