

BL. JUVENAL ANCINA



Blessed Juvenal is the only one of our Oratorian Blesseds to have known St Philip personally. A physician, he was moved to a deeper practice of his Faith one day when hearing the *Dies Irae* at a funeral. He and his brother Giovanni Matteo went to Rome seeking a vocation and thought of joining the Carthusians. On a second trip to Rome

Juvenal discovered the Oratory, and St Philip persuaded him to join, where he became one of the most popular preachers, and also composed music which was used at the Oratory exercises. In 1586 he was sent to the new Oratory at Naples, where his fame as a good preacher and holy priest continued to grow. When there was talk that he would be made a bishop he went into hiding for several months, but after St Philip's death he was unable to avoid the desires of the Holy Father and in 1602 was made Bishop of Saluzzo in Piedmont. St Francis de Sales was a close friend and gave testimony at the Process for Juvenal's beatification.

In 1604 Juvenal was poisoned by a friar whom he had rebuked for scandalous living, but refused to testify against him.

Juvenal's body rests in Saluzzo Cathedral, under an altar dedicated to him. He was beatified by Pope Leo XIII on 9th February, 1890, and his feast is kept each year on 30th August.


100TH ANNIVERSARY CORNER

Update on the Hall Renovation Project

Our Foundation Stone project for renovating the parish hall is getting close to completion, thanks to your wonderful generosity. Not surprisingly (considering we are dealing with a foundation more than a hundred years old), there have been some surprises. The original project was budgeted for \$200,000. We have raised about \$215,000 and have spent just over \$190,000, with little more than painting remaining to be done. However, we discovered the need to waterproof the entire south wall of the church, work that is now ongoing. That part of the project adds approximately \$50,000 to our costs.

Another discovery has been made regarding the steel beams in the entrance hallway to the parish hall, underneath the front steps of the church. We have found an excellent price of \$5,600 -- seven steel beams at \$800 each. On top of this will be engineering costs, and then finishing the entrance area.

The donations of our first parishioners a century and more ago built this wonderful church and hall. Now it is our task to keep it in good condition for the next century. Please pray for all who have donated and for those whose generosity will enable us to complete this project. God bless you all!
