<u>**100TH ANNIVERSARY CORNER</u></u> On September 16 at 8pm**, there will be a sung Mass for</u> the anniversary of the dedication of St Vincent de Paul church. The Mass will end our centenary year. On September 16, 1923, our church, "the upper church," was dedicated for the worship of God. *A reception will follow the Mass.* But why celebrate having a church?

A church is set apart primarily for the Holy Mass. In the Mass, we offer Christ's Body and Blood to the Father. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we offer ourselves through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ. As soon as it become legal to be a Christian in the Roman empire, we built churches so that Christ's flock might gather around the Lord. But to receive the Eucharist, we need the sacrament of Baptism. To be faithful to the Eucharist in the face of opposition, we need the sacrament of Confirmation. If we have lost our baptismal grace or want to grow in purity of heart, we need the sacrament of Confession. As Christ gives his spouse, the Church, his own body in Holy Communion, so God joins man and wife in the sacrament of Holy Matrimony. In order that we might have the Eucharist at all, God gives us the sacrament of Holy Orders, in which Christ continues to give us deacons, priests, and bishops. As we get close to the end of our lives, in order to prepare us for death and to endure the challenges of serious illness, Christ gave us the Sacrament of Sick (extreme Unction/Anointing of the Sick). All seven sacraments have been celebrated in our church over the last 100 years. Our church is meant to be a sign of Christ's presence. The church is a sign of Christ's body, the Church, gathered in this part of Toronto. Here at St Vincent's we honour Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist and give gratitude for all the sacraments Christ gives us. Here we prepare to receive these great gifts of grace!

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD


