

ORATORY SUMMER SCHOOL

Oratory Corner

One of the titles of St Philip Neri is the *Apostle of Rome*. He is sometimes called the Second Apostle of Rome to distinguish him from St Peter, the first Apostle of Rome. As St Peter brought the Gospel to Rome in the first century, so St Philip kept the Gospel alive in Rome in the 16th century.

An Apostle means 'one who is sent.' Jesus chose 12 of his disciples and named them Apostles. These men were sent to the ends of the earth to proclaim the message of Christ. Their leader on earth was Peter, the first Pope. St Peter went to Rome and established Rome as the place of his unique authority as head of the Church.

This weekend, we will be following the funeral ceremonies for Pope Francis, the 265th successor of St Peter. We will begin praying fervently for the election of a new pope. Let us turn to St Philip Neri for guidance. We have his image in our church. We have some relics of St Philip in our church. Let us visit his altar, below the statue of Mary. Pick up a prayer card.

St Philip is not only the Second Apostle of Rome; he is also the patron saint of Rome. He more than any other saint has been entrusted with the care of the eternal City. Even in his lifetime, St Philip became the trusted advisor of popes and even their confessors. In the litany of St Philip, he is called, "Counsellor of Popes."

We honour St Philip in our church because his sons, the Oratorians have been caring for our parish for 30 years. Let us take advantage of our closeness to St Philip. Let us get to know him better. Let us pray that our priests will be faithful sons of St Philip. Let us ask St Philip to obtain for us a wise and courageous and holy new pope!
