July 7 – 11: The Catechism of The Catholic Church July 14 – 18: Jubilee Year in the universal Church

Registration for the annual Oratory Summer School has opened. There are two sessions available. The first session offers a systematic introduction to The Catechism of The Catholic Church. The second session takes Jubilee Years as its theme, converging appropriately with 2025 being celebrated as a Jubilee Year in the universal Church and with the Toronto Oratory's own 50th anniversary, for St. Philip himself directed a confraternity dedicated to the care of Jubilee pilgrims in Rome. 50th Anniversary -- Oratory Corner

Pentecost – Confirmation

Why are the Oratorians so often speaking of the Holy Spirit? Just before Pentecost in 1544, St Philip Neri was praying in the catacomb of Saint Sebastian. As was his daily custom, he was praying for the gifts and graces of the Holy Spirit. Suddenly, while he was praying, the Holy Spirit appeared to him as a ball of fire. The flame went into his mouth and rested in his heart. He felt so much love and peace and joy. He felt pain in his chest as well.

From that day forward, St Philip was on fire to draw others to Christ. He taught his spiritual sons, the Oratorians, to spread devotion to the Holy Spirit. After St Philip died, the autopsy showed that his heart was enlarged. Two of his ribs were broken and arched to make room for his enlarged heart. People have called St Philip's condition: the stigmata of the Holy Spirit. Why would the Holy Spirit enlarge St Philip's heart?

Our Lord prayed at the Last Supper: "Father, I made known to them thy name, and I will make it known, that the love with which thou hast loved me may be in them, and I in them" (John 17:26). What is the love with which the Father loves the Son and the Son loves the Father? St Paul says: "the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." (Romans 5:5). Over the centuries, the Church has realized that the Holy Spirit is the personal Love between the Father and the Son.

Since the Holy Spirit is the living flame of Love and since the human heart is the symbol of love, it was fitting for the Holy Spirit to make St Philip's heart a symbol of his presence in the Church. St Philip lived at a time when people denied that the Catholic Church was the true home of the Holy Spirit. Protestants said you had to leave the Church to have the Holy Spirit. But God raised up St Philip as the Apostle of Rome. He helped remind the Church of the importance of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church and in the life of every Christian. St Philip showed forth the Catholic Church as the true dwelling place of the Holy Spirit.

Let us pray for our youth who are about to receive Confirmation. We welcome a successor of the Apostles, Bishop Robert Kasun, who will confirm a group of young people this Sunday. Confirmation is our own personal pentecost. St Philip reminds us that we can each have a personal relationship with the Holy Spirit. Confirmation makes that relationship a reality in our lives.
