



BLESSED SEBASTIAN VALFRE

"When it is all over you will not regret having suffered; rather you will regret having suffered so little, and suffered that little so badly."

Bl Sebastian was born on March 9, 1629 to a humble and poor family. He remained poor throughout his life in the Congregation of the Oratory at Turin. At the Oratory he wished simply to serve the people of God in whatever capacity he was given, whether in pastoral work, house administration, scholarly pursuits, or sweeping the stairs. He would as happily go to the death beds of the poor or the Royal family of Savoy. Most of his life was spent wandering around the streets and squares simply being available, speaking of God's love for all men and of the love that we should have for each other. The Apostle of Turin died on January 30, 1710. He was beatified by Pope Gregory XVI in 1834.

ORATORY CORNER

Newman in a Nutshell 7.0

We have been looking at what St John Henry Newman has to teach us. The Church has declared him a doctor of the Church for our times. Last week, we looked at his teaching on **original sin**. Newman is not saying that you can prove original sin from our experience. But he is saying that you can almost prove it. He started from the *fact* of incredible human conflict and sorrow in the world. To his mind, the evil and challenges in the world suggest either that God does not exist or that humanity is at odds with God. If God is all good and all powerful, why does all this terrible suffering exist? Why do human beings come into the world without knowledge of God? Why do we not know where we come from? Why do human beings not know their family connection to each other and to God? Since Newman believes that God exists, he thinks the other explanation must be the case.

Newman tries to illustrate his thinking with the example of a young man from a very good family. This young man has intelligence and education. But this young man is unable to say where his parents are or what they did for him. Newman's point is that there must be something in the background of this young man that he is not telling us. How can this young man have all this good upbringing and not know about his parents? Why will he not speak of them? There is a *mystery to his origin*, Newman says. In a similar way, human beings have intelligence. We have freedom. We have been able to make remarkable things. Why are we so unable on our own to speak of God? Why do we not immediately know God? Newman's point is that we must be involved in some "terrible aboriginal calamity." The human race must be "out of joint with the purposes of its Creator."

Our alienation from God and its consequences, above all, our tendency to sin, is what Our Lord came to remedy.


